 of this my will revoking all former wills by me made or witness a
 whereof I have signed my hand and seal the day and year as
 above written - *John Sherman* - signed by the said John as
 Attorney the testator in the presence of us present at the same time
 who in his presence and in the presence of each other attest and sub-

 whatsoever and wheresoever upon trust after payment thereof of my
 debts funeral and testamentary expenses and the charges thereon after giving
 to retain the residue of such stock and effects to and for the use and
 benefit of my sister Sarah Franklyn the sum of ten
 pounds sterling to my wife Sarah Allen the sum of fifty pounds ster-
 ling to each of my five wives namely Hannah Ellen Penelope Mary
 Anne and Emily Allen the sum of five pounds sterling and to each of
 my three wives namely Hannah Deborah and Elizabeth Franklyn the
 sum of five pounds sterling And I appoint the said Richard Allen sole
 Executrix of this my will As witness my hand this fifth day of Septem-
 ber one thousand eight hundred and fifty four - *Penelope Allen* -
 signed by the said Penelope Allen as and for her last will and testament
 in the presence of us present at the same time who in her presence and
 in the presence of each other have hereto subscribed our names as wit-
 nesses - *H. J. Ashley, J. H. Hungerford, Berke - Frederic John*

 diversures Companies or from any other source or property whatsoever And
 I appoint the aforesaid Elizabeth Almain John Whites of Dr. W. Canter-
 bury Dean of St. Dunstons Church London and Henry Stephens of Dr. W. Canter-
 bury Dean of St. Dunstons Church London joint Executors
 of this my last Will finally at the decease of my dearly beloved wife
 Elizabeth aforesaid I recommend to the most special notice of John Whites
 and Henry Stephens aforesaid my two sons William Almain and Thomas
 Almain that the residue of all property be made use of by them the aforesaid
 John Whites and Henry Stephens to the best of their abilities for the benefit
 of the aforesaid William and Thomas Almain my lawful children And I
 do hereby disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former Will
 by me in any way before now ratified and confirming this and no
 other to be my last Will and Testament or witnesses thereof I have there-
 unto set my hand the 23rd day of January in the year of our Lord one
 thousand eight hundred and fifty five.

 Middlesex Essex and made oath that he is one of the subscribers
 witnesses to the last Will and Testament of Thomas Almain late of Dr. W.
 Canterbury Dean of St. Dunstons Church London in the County of
 Middlesex Essex of Galvantes Iron Bridges the said
 Will being now taken and annexed and bearing date the twenty third day of
 January 1855 and having now carefully inspected the said Will and observed
 the surname of the said deceased appearing there subscribed at the end of
 the said Will the Appraiser further made oath that the said deceased
 only executed the said Will on the aforesaid day of the date thereof by
 subscribing his name at the end thereof as now appears but having
 through the difficulty of writing while in bed made the surname in his
 said signature in a very imperfect manner the said deceased not being
 satisfied therewith then and there wrote his name in duplicate to the said
 Will as the same now appears thereon in the presence of him the Appraiser
 and of Richard Brody and William Cecily Mill the other subscribers wit-
 nesses thereto all of whom were present at the same time And thereupon
 subscribed their names to and attested with the execution of the said Will
 in the presence of each other and of the said deceased - **George Alchin**
 On the first day of March 1855 the said George Alchin was duly sworn to the
 truth of this Affidavit before me J. Spinkes Sur. - W. J. Pritchard Not. pub.

Proved at London the 5th March 1855 before the Reverend John Daggard
 Doctor of Laws and Surrogate by the oaths of Elizabeth Almain widow the said John
 Whites in the Will written Whites and Henry Stephens the Executors to whom Power was
 granted having been first sworn duly to administer.
