of me William Andrew of Lancashire in the County of Lancashire I give a
 bequeath and bequeath unto my dear wife Elizabeth in full and entire
 and personal estate whatsoever and wheresoever and whereto in possession
 execution remainder or expectation and to her heirs and assigns for ever and
 so heretofore nominate trustee and appoint unto me as a wise man and
 know and my friend Thomas Troughton of Lancashire in the said County of
 Lancashire Esquire and Executor of this my will and so heretofore do
 give that the said Thomas Troughton shall be charged and charged with
 in writing and monies as he shall actually receive by virtue of the trusts hereby
 expressed in this and shall not be answerable or accountable for any default
 defect or other person with whom or in whose hands the said trust monies
 or any part thereof shall be placed for safe custody or otherwise nor for the
 insufficiency of any security upon which the same shall be invested nor for
 any loss misfortune or damage which may happen in the execution of a
 the said trusts unless the same shall happen by or through his own wilful
 default and also that it shall be lawful for the said Thomas Troughton by
 and out of the monies which shall come to his hands to retain and reimburse
 himself all costs charges damages and expenses which he shall sustain or
 expend in or about the execution of the said trusts or in relation thereto
 whatsoever which the said William Andrew have to this my last will and
 testament set in hand this twenty third day of January one thousand eight
 hundred and forty five. *Wm Andrew* — Signed by the said testator

 but not to comprise in this my last will and testament of any land
 or tenement in which I have any share or part at the time of my decease
 nor of any debt due to me by any person nor of any other property
 and assigns for his and their own proper use and benefit and
